Shown in size $42 \frac{1}{2}$ " / 108 cmIntended to be worn with 2-4" / 5-10 cm of positive ease.

Yarn: 3 (4, 4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 5, 5, 5) skeins Briggs & Little Regal (272 yds / 248 m per 4 oz / 113 g skein; 100% Wool) in #13 Light Grey

Needles & Notions: Size 7 US / 4.5 mm circular needle, 32" / 80 cm long Size 6 US / 4 mm circular needle, 32" / 80 cm long Size 6 US / 4 mm set of double-pointed needles Cable needle, stitch markers, stitch holders, sewing pins

Gauge: 18 sts and 27 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Stockinette stitch using size 7 US / 4.5 mm needles after blocking

Construction Notes: This classic pullover vest is worked in one piece to the armholes, then divided for front and back. The vest features a progression from cabled ribbing at the lower edge, through an all over lattice cable pattern, into a herringbone pattern and then to stockinette stitch in the chest. All stitch patterns are given in both chart and row-by-row form.
