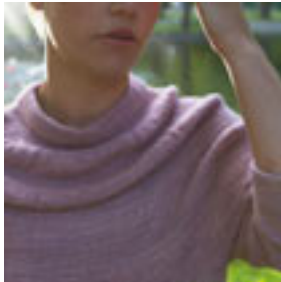


Twist Collective

This sweater is knit from the top down, creating three sets of “rippled” folds as you work your way down the yoke. The finished garment looks a little strange when off the body, as the extra fabric in the ripples creates a very tall and oddly shaped yoke, but rest assured it will look wonderfully elegant when worn.

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Finished measurements:

Bust: 33 (35, 37, 39, 41, 43, 45, 47, 49, 51, 53, 55)" / 84 (89, 94, 99, 104, 109, 114.5, 119.5, 124.5, 129.5, 134.5, 139.5) cm

Shown in size 35" / 89 cm

Intended to be worn with 2–3" / 5–7.5 cm positive ease.

Yarn: 7 (8, 8, 9, 10, 11, 11, 12, 12, 13, 13, 14) skeins The Fibre Company Canopy Fingering Weight (200 yds / 182 m per 1 ¾ oz / 50 g skein; 50% Baby Alpaca, 30% Merino Wool, 20% Bamboo) in Rosehip

Needles & Notions: Size 4 US / 3.5 mm circular needle, 16" / 40 cm long

Size 4 US / 3.5 mm circular needle, 24" / 60 cm long

Set of 5 double-pointed needles or longer circular needle for magic loop

Size 6 US / 4.0 mm circular needle, 16" / 40 cm long

Size 6 US / 4.0 mm circular needle, 24" / 60 cm long

Size C-2 or D-3 US / 2.75 or 3.25 mm crochet hook, several yards of smooth fingering weight waste yarn for provisional cast on, 20 stitch markers

Gauge: 22 sts and 32 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Stockinette stitch using smaller needles

Construction Notes: Top-down, seamless

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
