### Finished measurements:

Bust: 29 ¼ (32, 35, 37)" / 74.5 (81.5, 89, 94) cm unstretched

Length: 15 ¼ (16, 17¾, 18 ½)" / 38.5 (40.5, 45, 47) cm

Shown in size 29 ¼" / 74.5 cm

Intended to be worn with 4–6" / 10–15 cm negative ease.

**Yarn:** 9 (10, 11, 12) skeins HiKoo Yarns Simplicity (117 yds / 107 m per 1 ¾ oz / 50 g skein; 55% Merino Superwash, 28% Acrylic, 17% Nylon) in #012 Blue Iris

### Needles & Notions:

Size 6 US / 4 mm circular needle, 29" / 74 cm long

Size 6 US / 4 mm circular needle, 16" / 40 cm long

Size 6 US / 4 mm set of two double-pointed needles

Stitch markers, stitch holders, tapestry needle, one button ½" / 12 mm diameter

**Gauge:** 32 sts and 28 rows = 4" / 10 cm in K2, P2 ribbing unstretched; 24 sts and 28 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Stockinette stitch

**Construction Notes:** This sweater is worked in one piece from the top down. An eyelet neckband is followed by a raglan yoke. After dividing the sleeves from the body, several tiers of increases are worked, integrated into the ribbed pattern. The ruffled bell sleeves are also shaped with tiers of increases. The drawstring at the neck is worked as i-cord.
