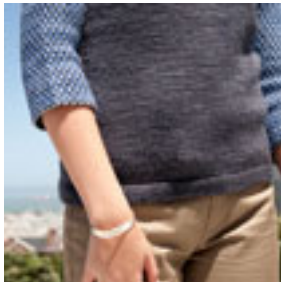

Finished measurements:

Bust: 29 ½ (33 ½, 37 ¼, 41 ½, 45 ½, 49 ½, 53 ½, 57 ½, 61 ½)" / 75 (85, 94.5, 105.5, 115.5, 125.5, 136, 146, 156) cm

Length: 24 ¼ (24 ¾, 25, 25 ½, 25 ¾, 26, 26 ¾, 26 ¾)" / 61.5 (63, 63.5, 65, 64, 65.5, 66, 63, 66.5) cm

Shown in size 33 ½" / 85 cm

Intended to be worn with -2 to 2" /

Yarn: Lorna's Laces Shepherd Worsted (225 yds / 206 m per 4 oz / 113 g skein; 100% Superwash Merino Wool):

3 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 6, 6, 6) skeins in #58ns

Kerfuffle (MC)

1 (1, 1, 1, 1, 1, 1, 1, 2) skein(s) in #41ns China Blue (CC1)

1 (1, 1, 1, 1, 1, 1, 1, 2) skein(s) #56ns Fjord (CC2)

Needles & Notions:

Size 5 US / 3.75 mm circular needle, 24" / 60 cm or 32" / 80 cm

Size 7 US / 4.5 mm circular needle, 24" /

60 cm or 32" / 80 cm

Size 9 US / 5.5 mm needles

Size 10 US / 6 mm needles

Size 10 ½ US / 6.5 mm needles

Stitch markers, tapestry needle, three hook and eye closures ¾" / 19 mm wide, three decorative buttons, sewing needle and thread

Gauge: 20 sts and 28 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Stockinette stitch using size 7 US / 4.5 mm needles

19 sts and 40 rows = 4" / 10 cm in linen stitch using size 10 ½ US / 6.5 mm needles

Construction Notes: The body begins with a turned hem and is worked in the round to the armholes, then divided for front and back. The raglan sleeves are worked separately, beginning with an unusual two-color cast on at the cuff. The Left front raglan is left open, joined by hooks and eyes and topped with decorative buttons.
