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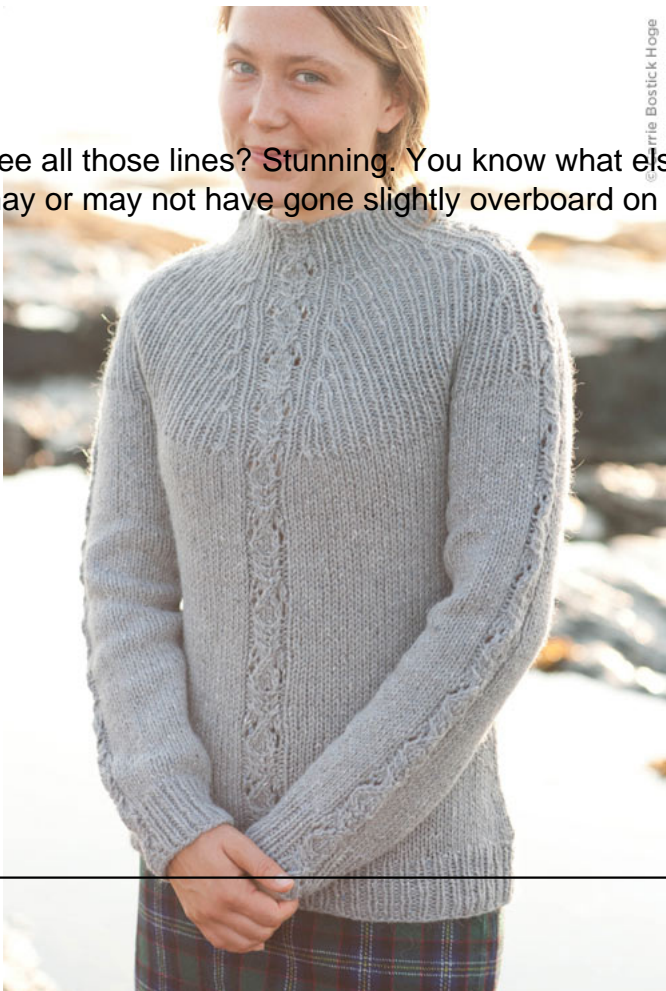

I'm feeling pretty smitten with it right now. When you knit one, make the sleeves just a tiny bit long, so you can gather them around your hands when the cold wind blows.
