

The <u>Orvokki</u> set is inspired by Finnish national costumes. I have wanted to use them somehow in a design for a long time now. Finnish costumes are simple and clear, but still beautiful with great details.



The flower is modified from the old Finnish cross stitch model which I found in a very old embroidery book.




The mittens have buttons on the wrist, and the button hole is worked out of the i-cord edging. I love that little purely decorative, not functional detail. The yarn, <u>Halcyon Victorian 2-Ply</u> was a little rough to work with at first, but softened with washing and use.



The hat was interesting to knit. I worked it again and again until the form of it became clear. I want to shape it using the same idea I used in my version of <u>Tychus</u>.



The buttons are worn in the back of the head, the whole thing knitted one side to the other with the flower band in front.
