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Twirl girl. This flirty shawl begins with a single strip that fishtails into a a slip-stitch scale pattern.

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Finished measurements:

Wingspan: 64" / 162.5 cm

Length at center back: 17" / 43 cm

Yarn:

Sunshine Yarns Merino Silk Fine (430 yd / 393 m per 3 ½ oz / 100 g skein; 50% Superwash Merino, 50% Silk):

2 skeins in Peacock (MC)

2 skeins in Orange Poppy (CC)

Needles & Notions:

Size 1 ½ US / 2.5 mm circular needle, 60" / 150 cm long

Two size 1 ½ US / 2.5 mm double-pointed needles, optional for starter strip

One size 2 ½ US / 3 mm double-pointed needle for bind-off

30 stitch markers, tapestry needle

Gauge:

28 sts and 42 rows = 4" / 10 cm over Chart C pattern using smaller needles

When measuring row gauge, count only rows that do not include slipped stitches.

27 sts and 42 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Stockinette Stitch using smaller needles

Construction Notes: A two-color shawl worked with slipped stitches. The shawl begins with a long strip for the top edge, then is worked out and down in a slip-stitch scale pattern. Striped triangular "fish tails" are worked in the lower section to give the shawl a flirty shape. Patterns are given in both chart form and row-by-row instructions.

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
