



This simple scoop neck tank is detailed with pleats knit at the shoulders and the lower edge.

Bust: 32 ¾ (34 ¾, 36 ¾, 38 ¾, 40 ¾, 42 ¾, 44 ¾, 46 ¾, 48 ¾, 50 ¾)" / 83 (88.5, 93.5, 98.5, 103.5, 108.5, 113.5, 118.5, 124, 129) cm

Length: 21 ¼ (21 ¾, 22 ¼, 22 ½, 23, 23 ¾, 24, 24 ½, 25, 25 ½)" / 54 (55, 56.5, 57, 58.5, 60.5, 61, 62, 63.5, 65) cm

Shown in size 32 ¾" / 83 cm

Intended to be worn with 0–1" / 0–2.5 cm ease.

Yarn: 2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3) skeins Blue Moon Fiber Arts Marine Silk Sport (324 yds / 296 m per 3 ½ oz / 100 g skein; 51% Silk, 29% Merino, 20% Sea Cell Rayon) in China Rose

Estimated yardage required: 550 (585, 620, 653, 687, 721, 755, 789, 823, 857) yds / 503 (535, 567, 598, 629, 660, 691, 722, 753, 784) m

Needles & Notions:

Size 4 US / 3.5 mm circular needle, 24" / 60 cm long

Size 4 US / 3.5 mm set of 5 double-pointed needles

Spare circular needle size 4 US / 3.5 mm or smaller, 24" / 60 cm long, stitch markers, stitch holders, tapestry needle, optional needle and thread to sew down pleats

Gauge: 24 sts and 32 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Stockinette stitch

Construction Notes: The tank is worked in the round, beginning with a turned hem. A single pleat is worked just above the lower edge. The body is shaped through the waist, and then divided at the armholes. The front and back are worked separately to the shoulders. The front has five pleats at each side of the neck. The shoulders are grafted together. The neck edge is finished with an attached i-cord.

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
